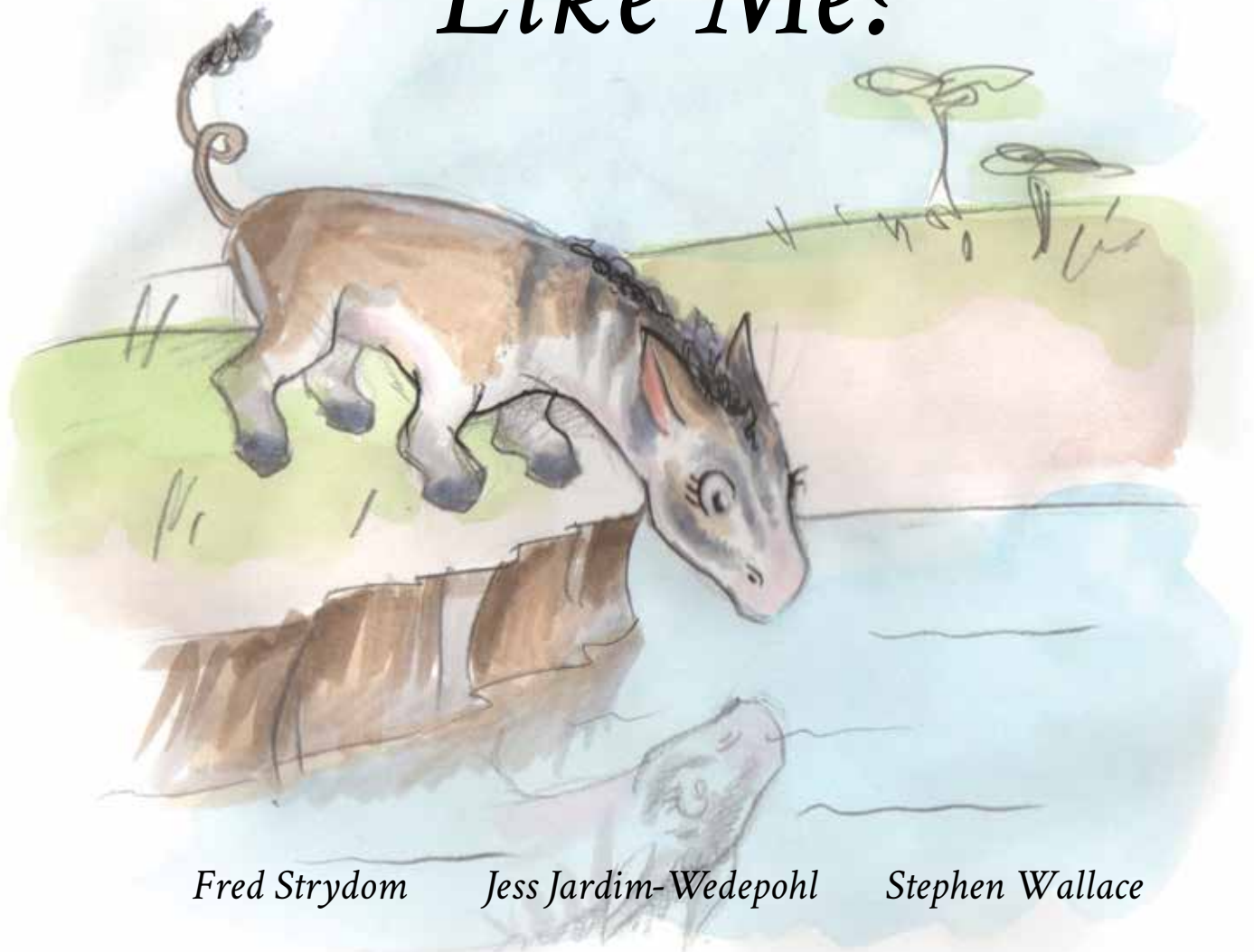

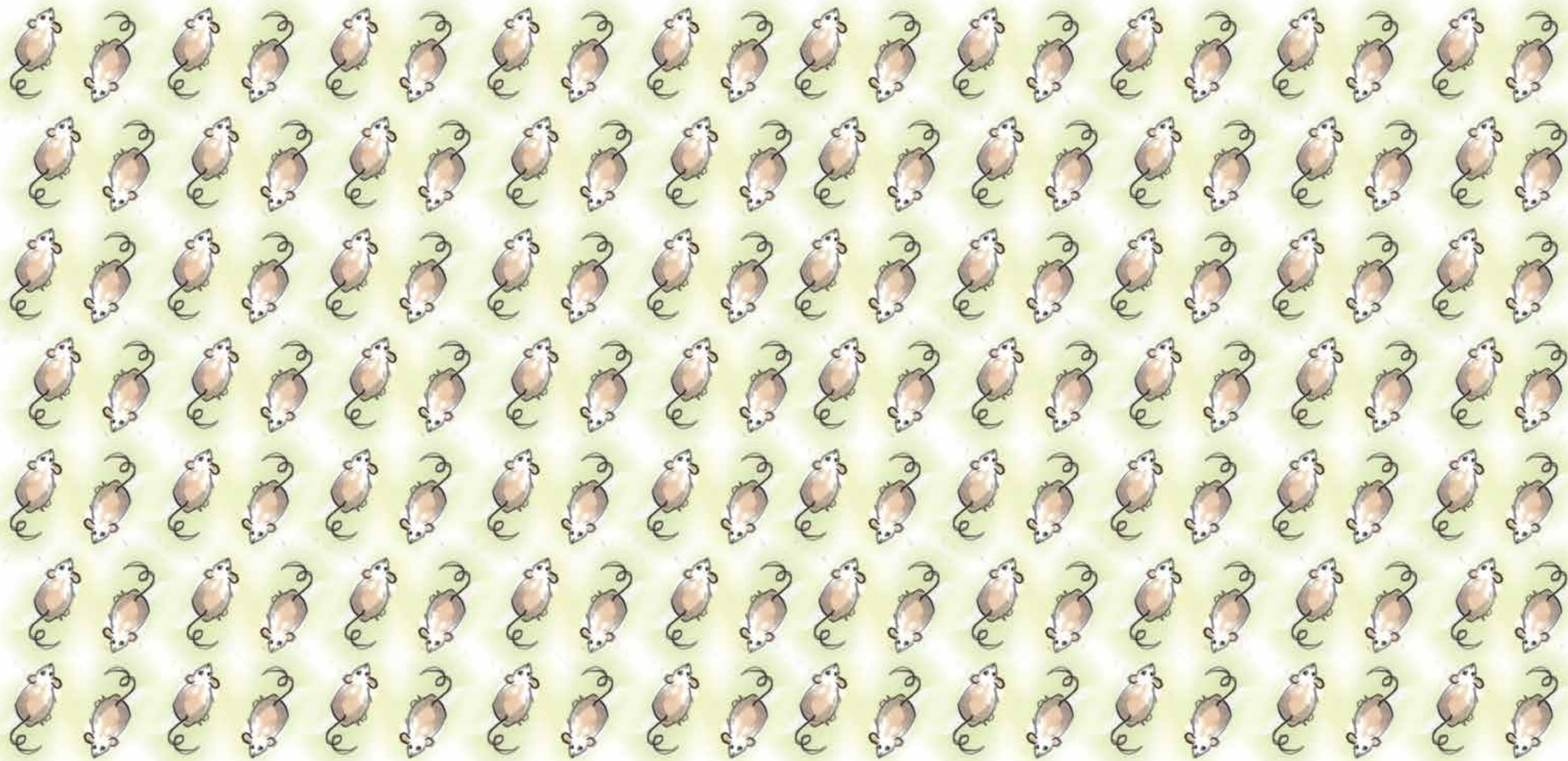

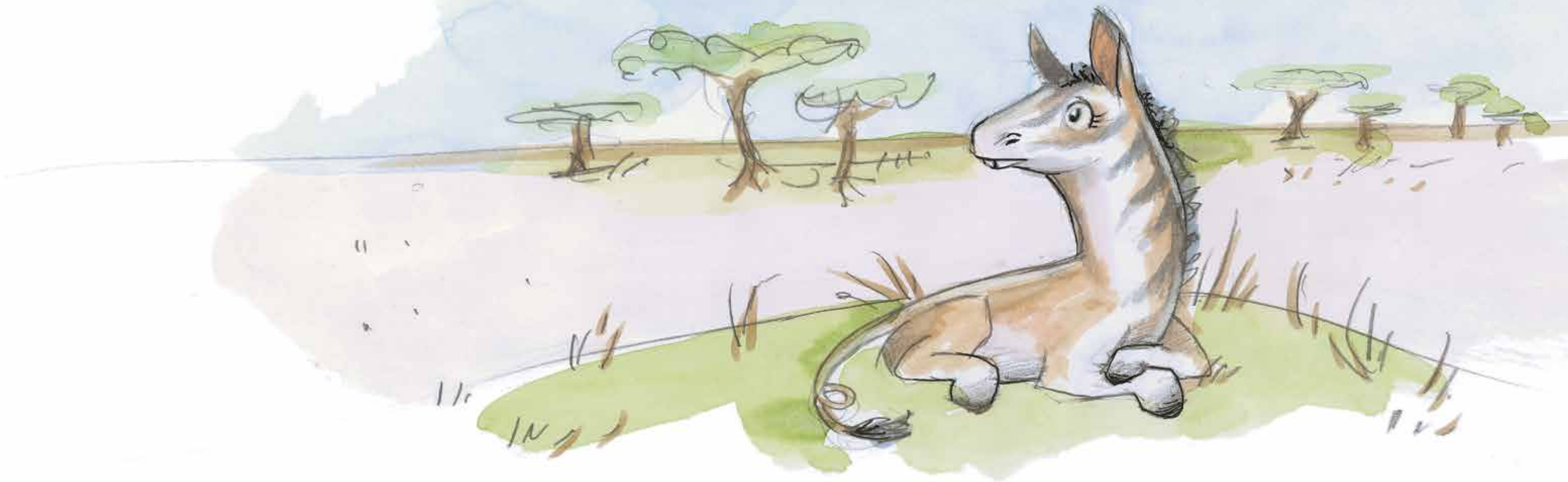

Who looks the same.



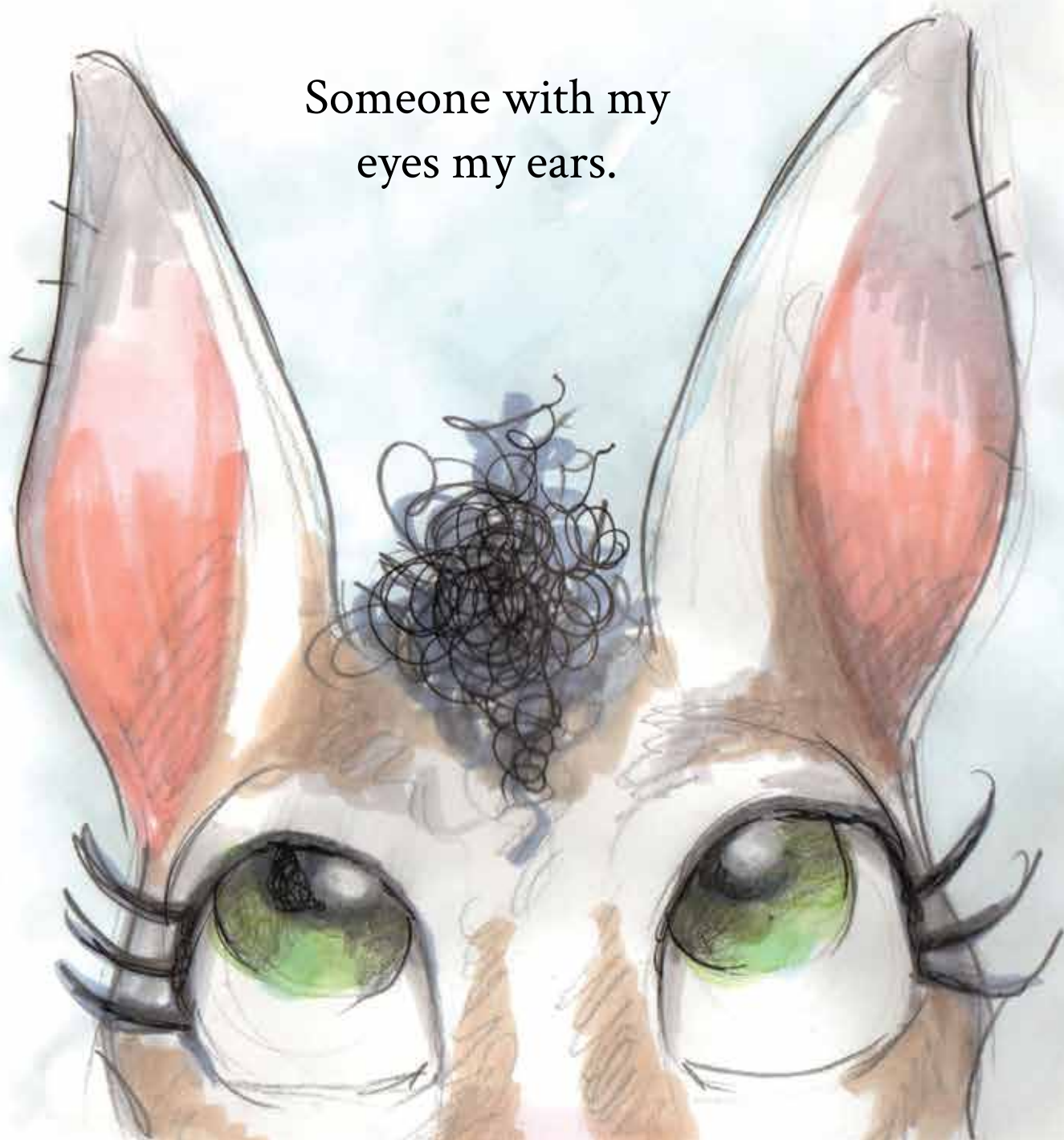
And talks the same.



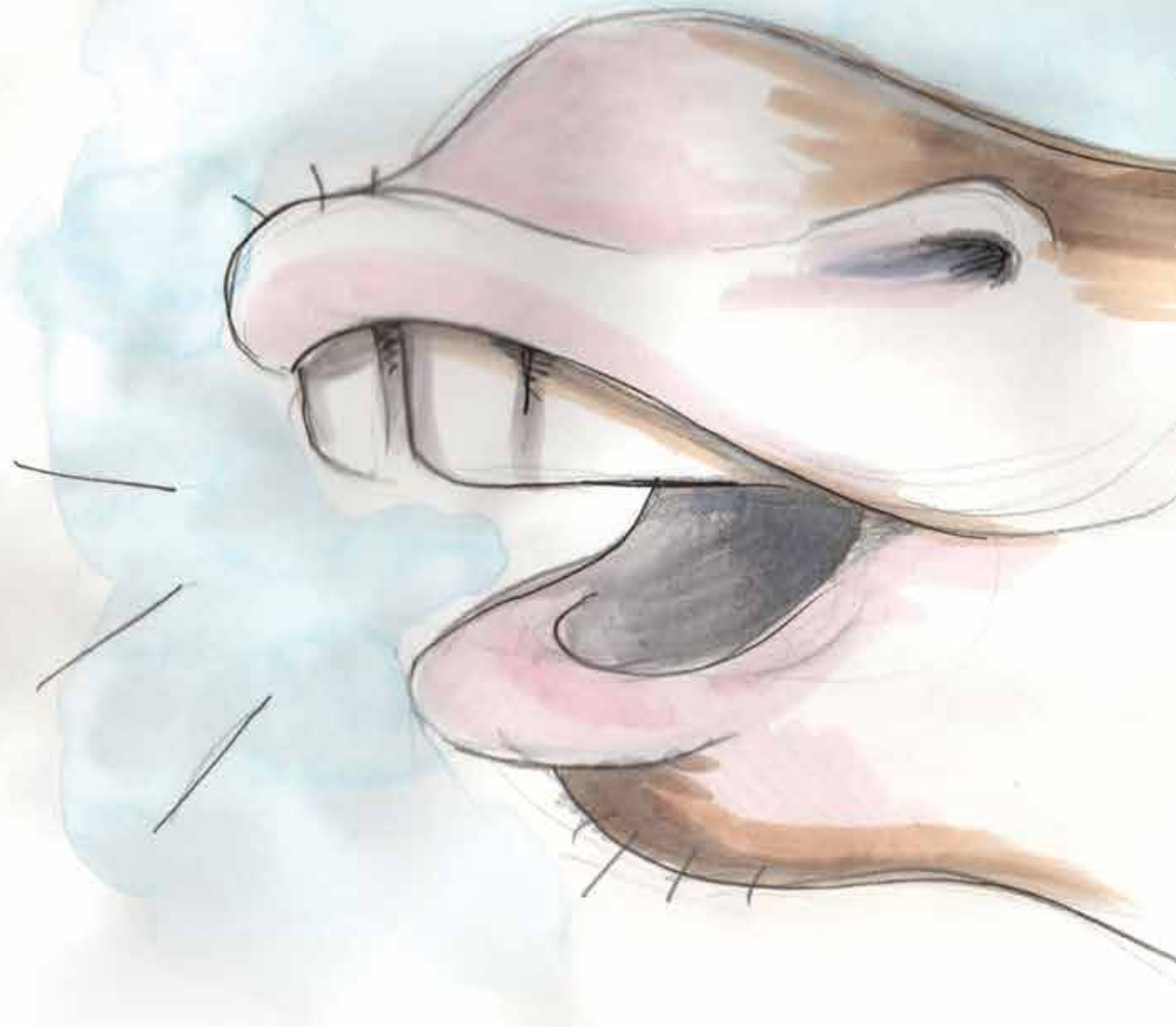
And even has my curls.

Who can do what I can do ...



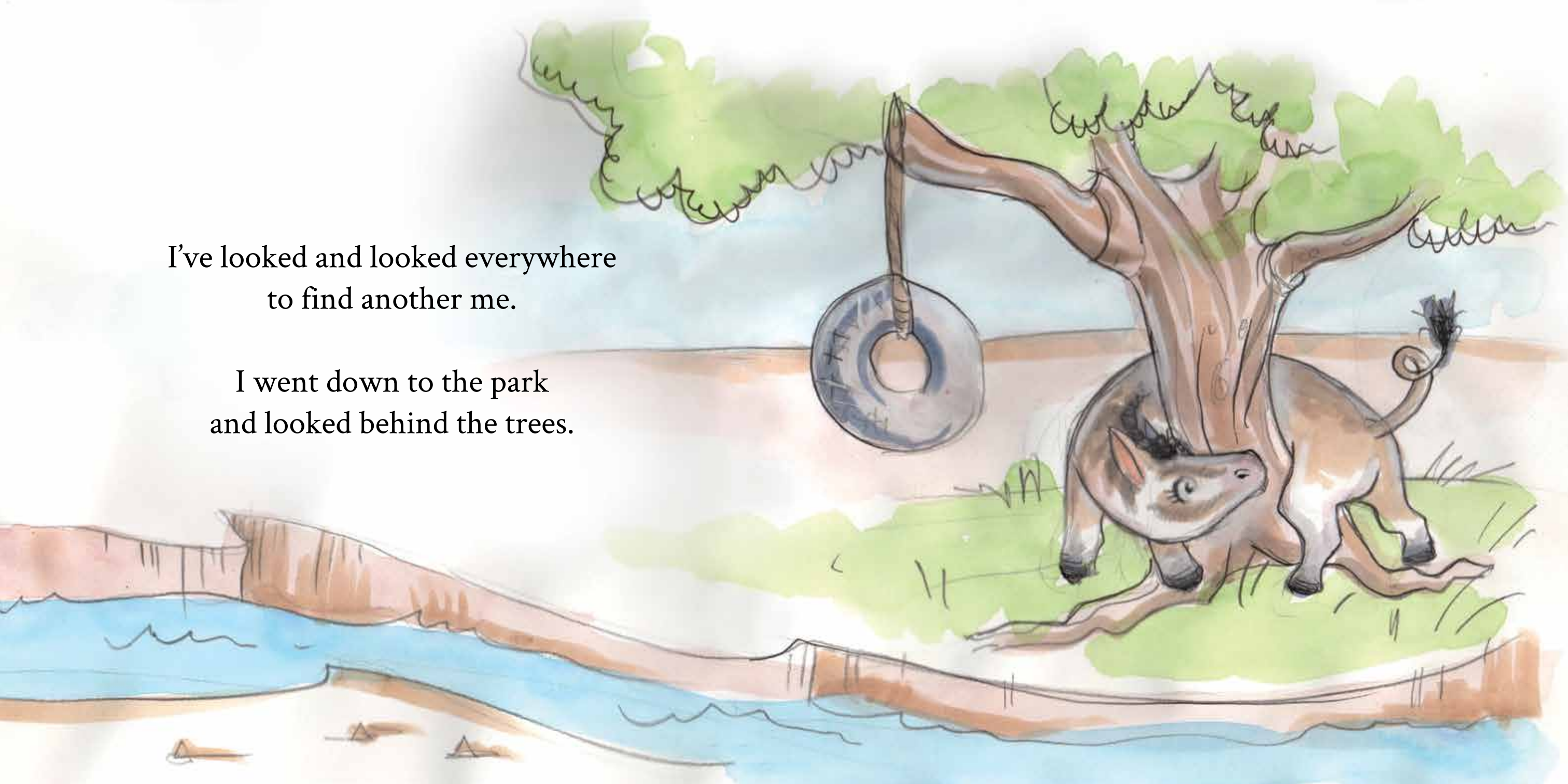


... and can't do what I can't.

I looked around, up and down ...

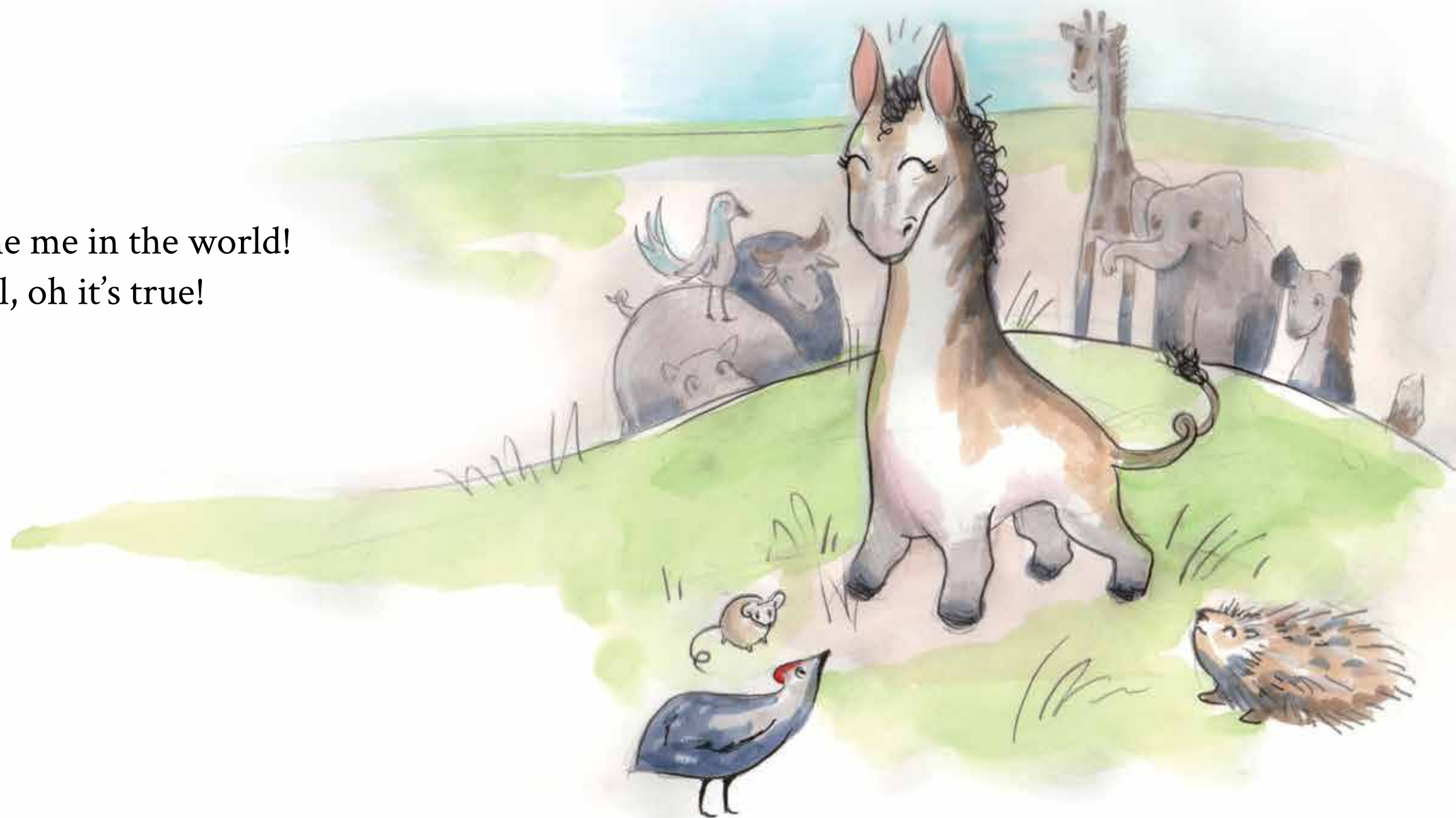
... at every single face.
