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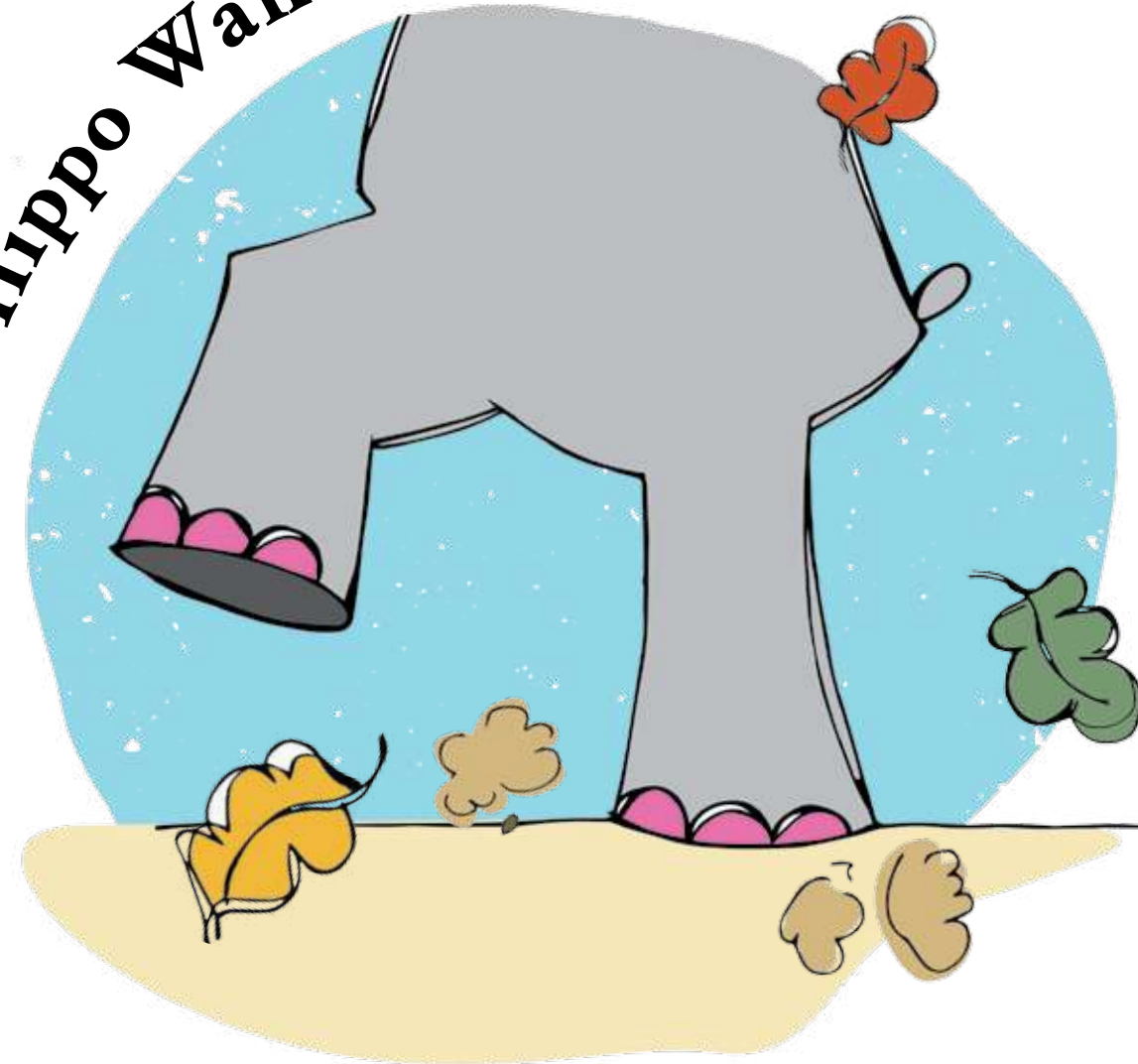
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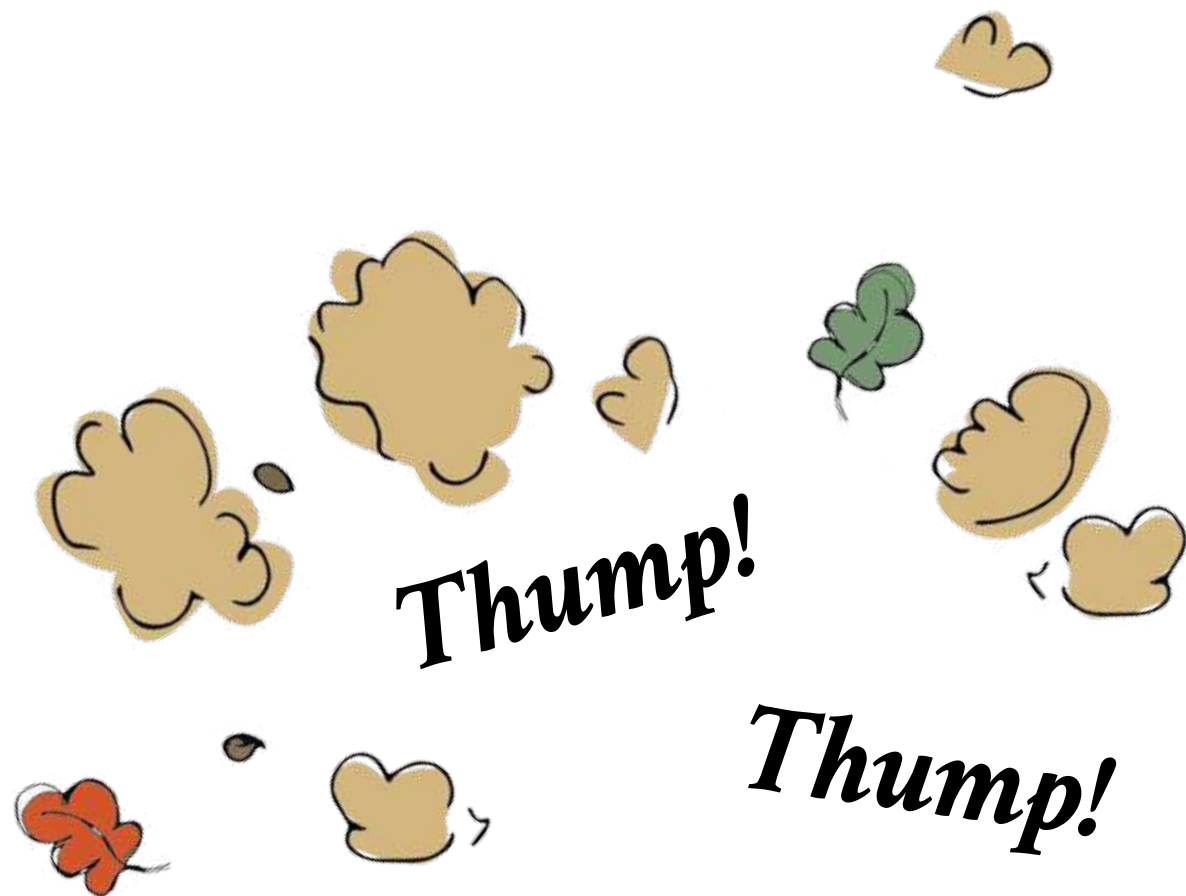
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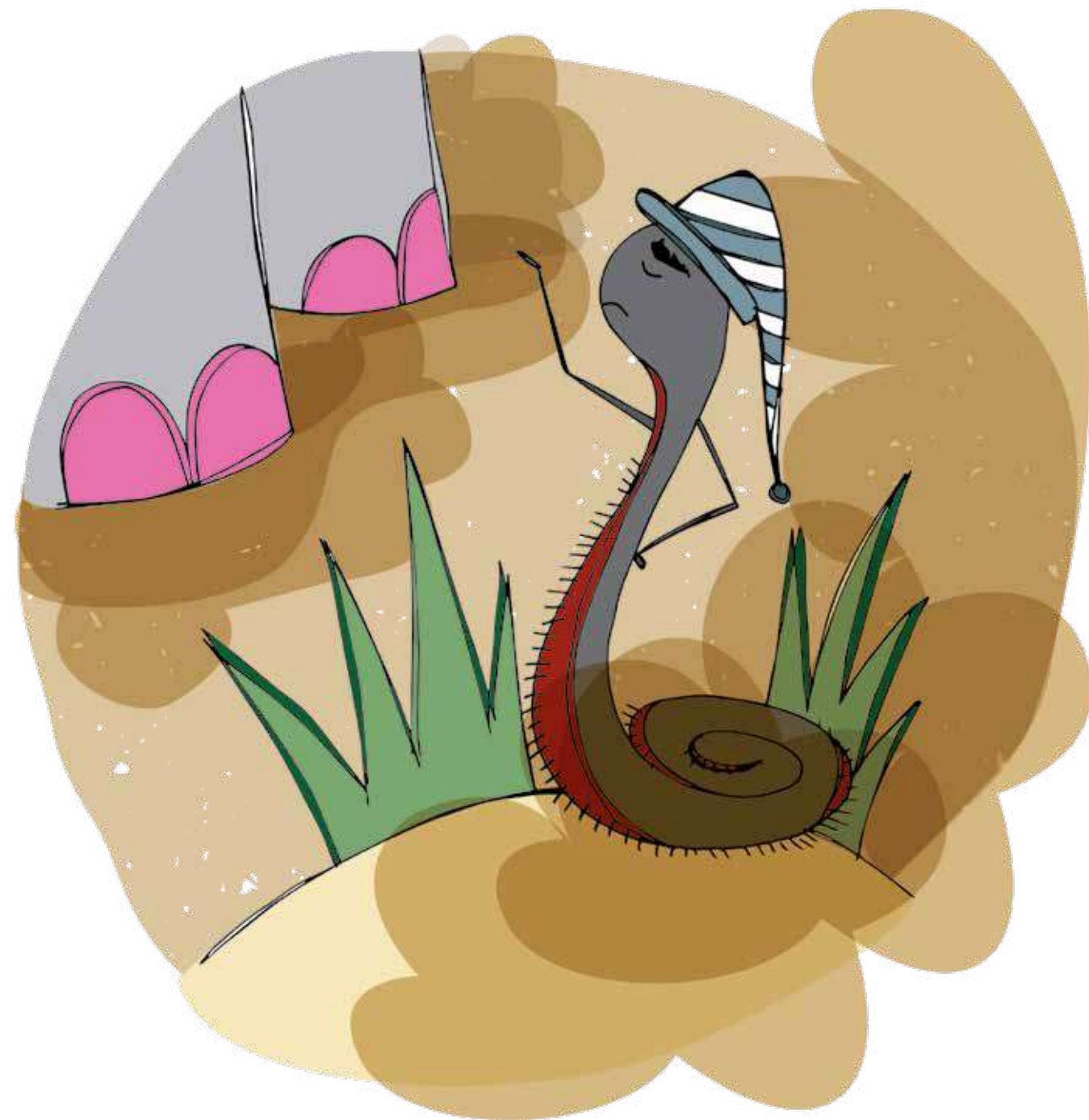
Hippo wants to dance.

“Go dance somewhere else.”





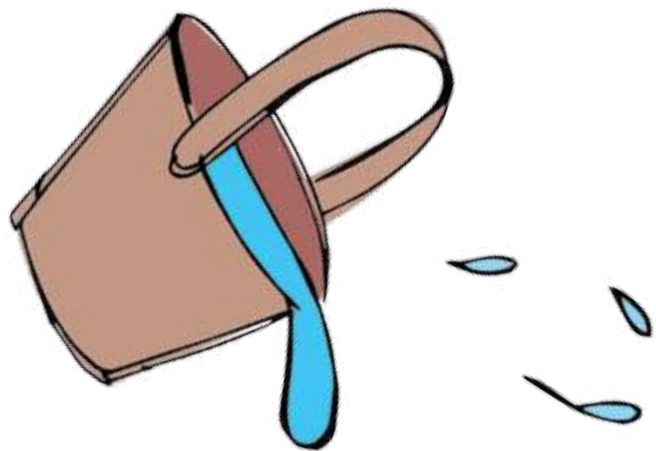
Hippo wants to dance.

Squash!





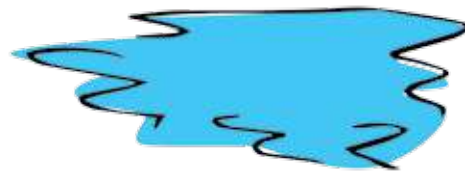
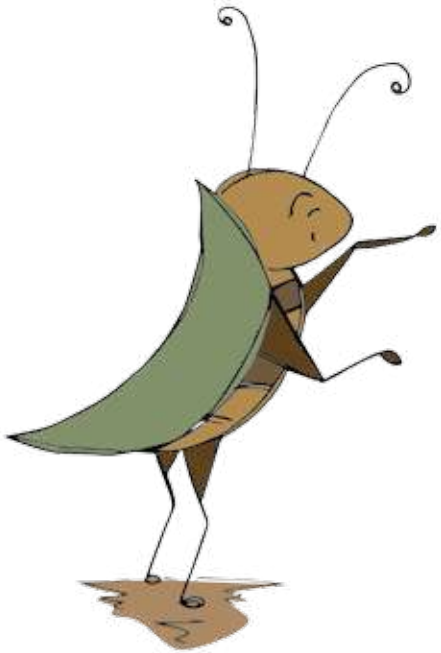
“Why don’t you stop dancing?”
