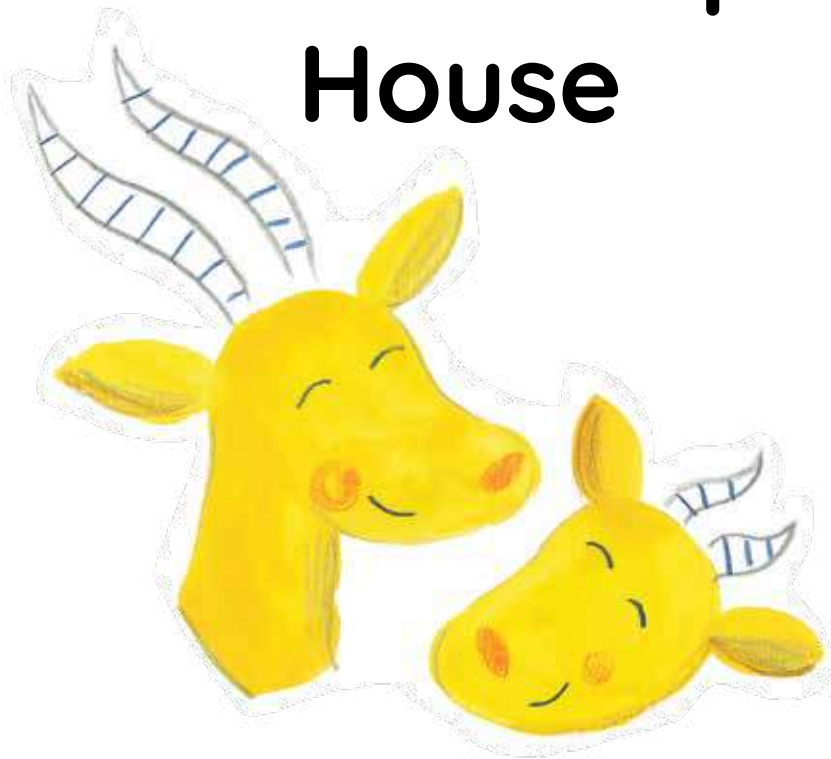

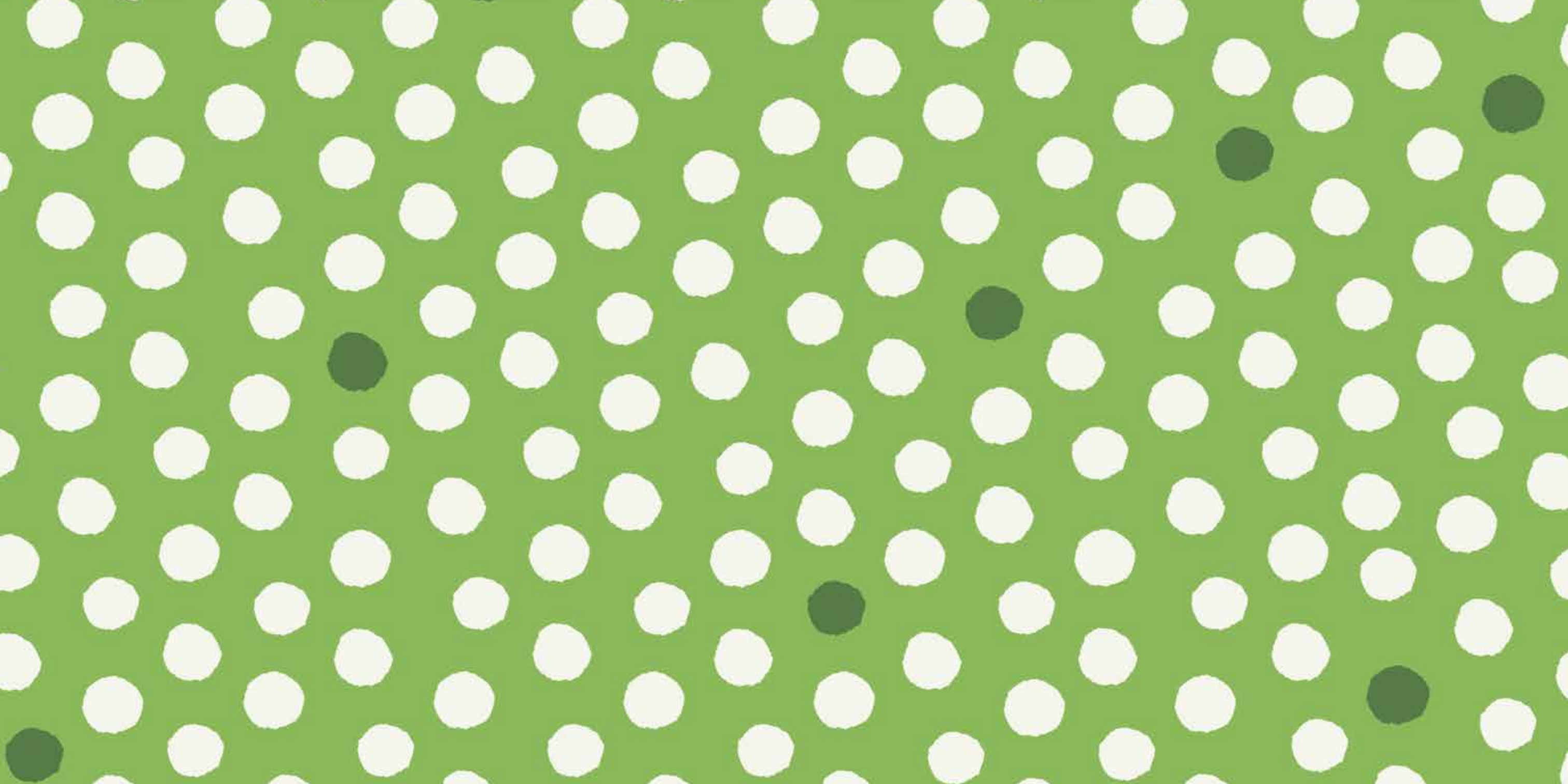

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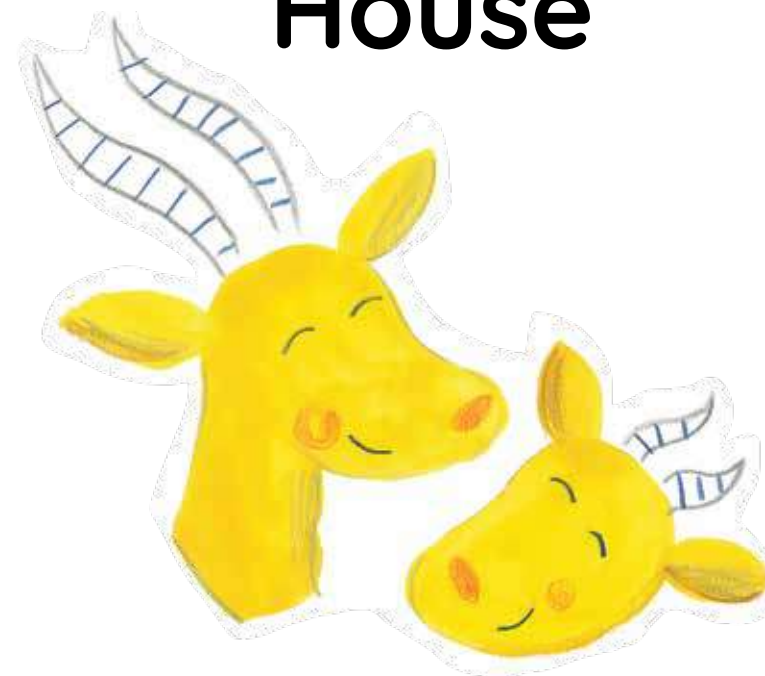

BANG! **SMASH!**

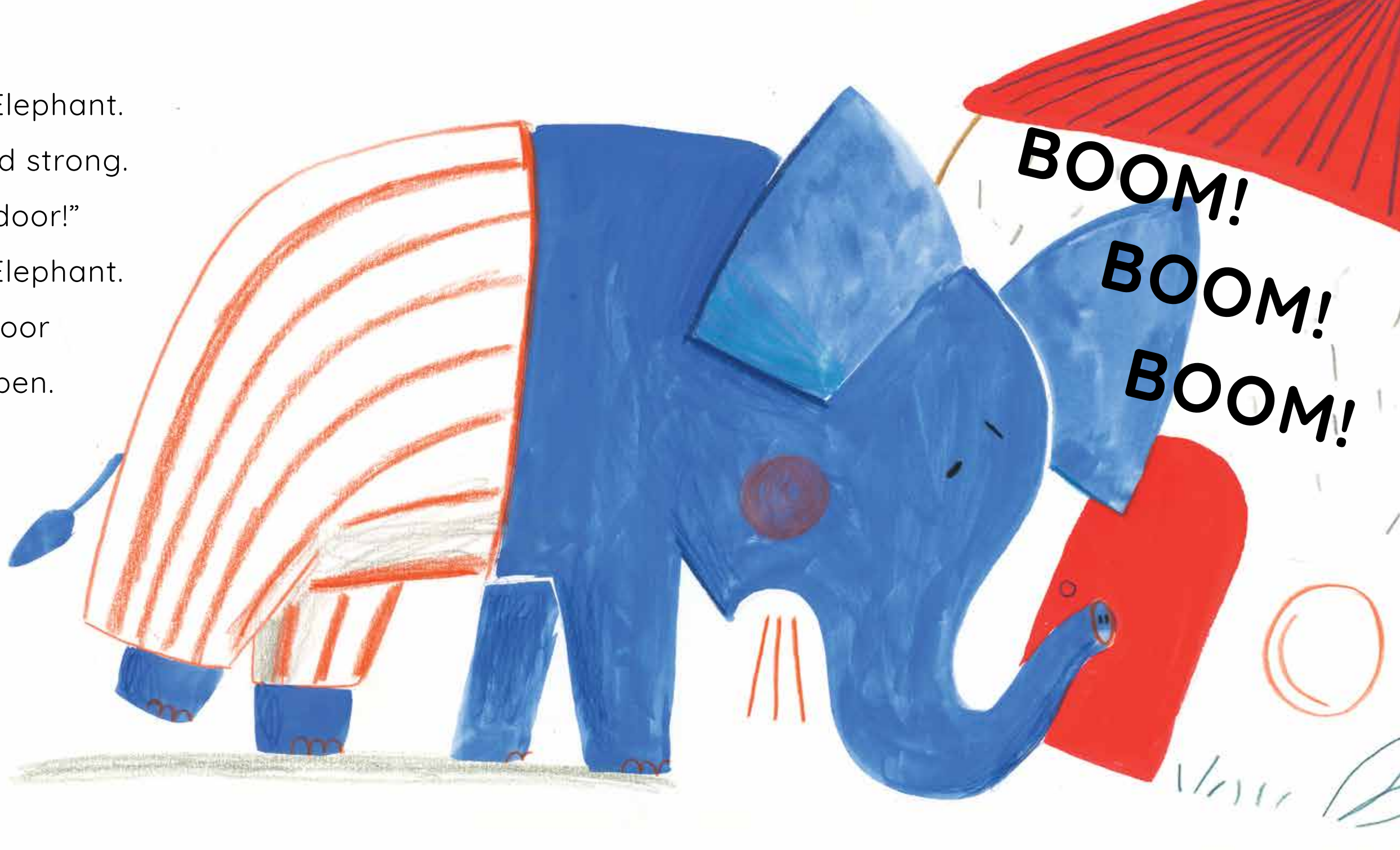
But the door did not open.

did not open.

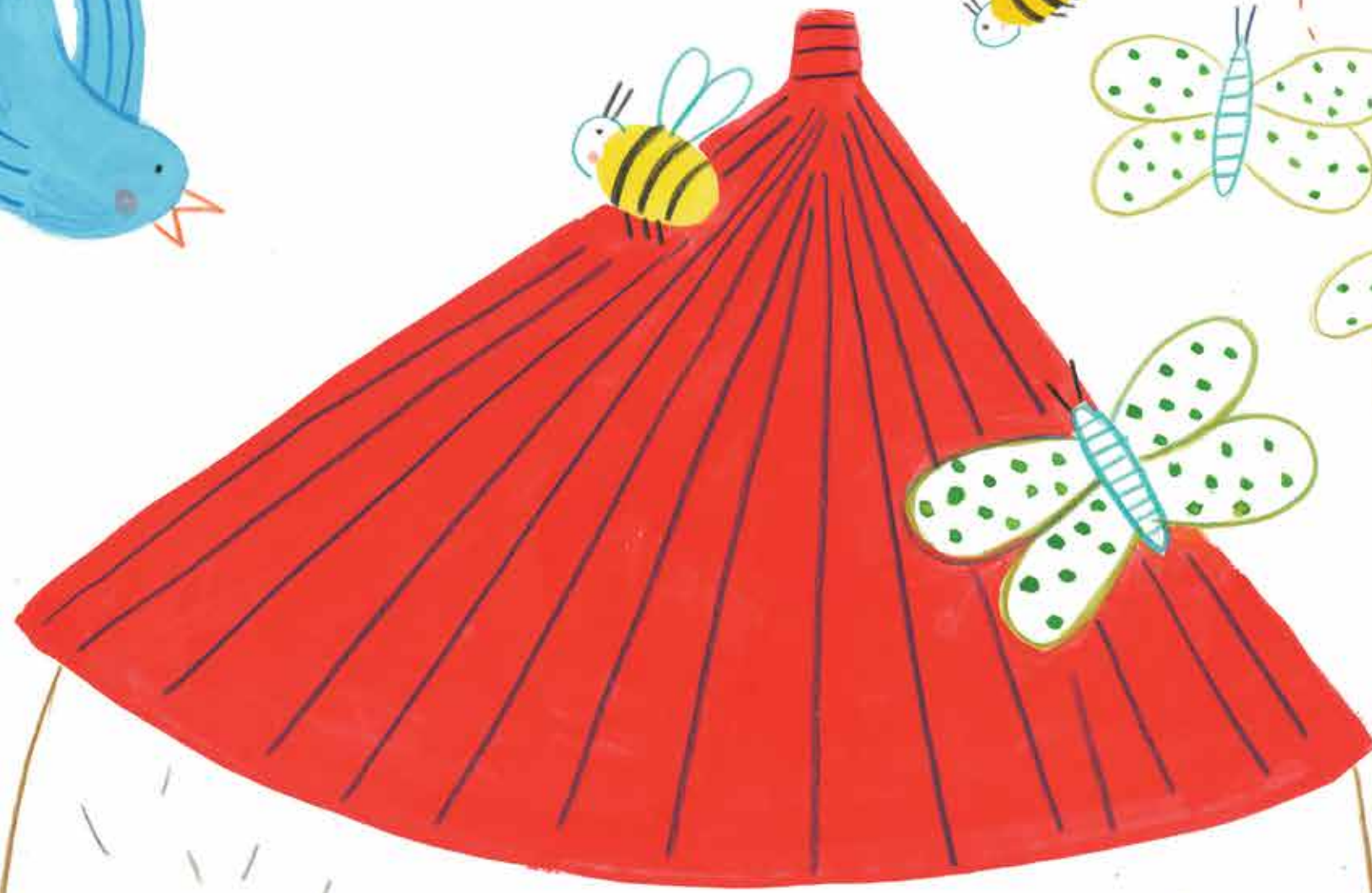
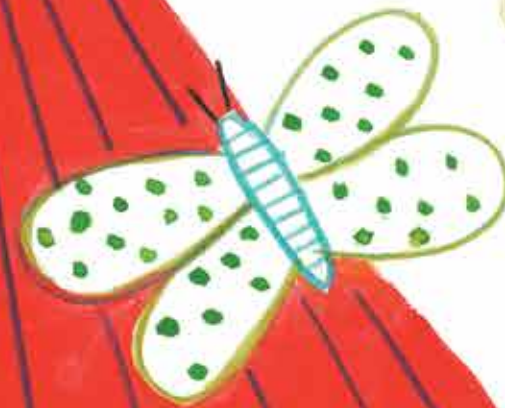
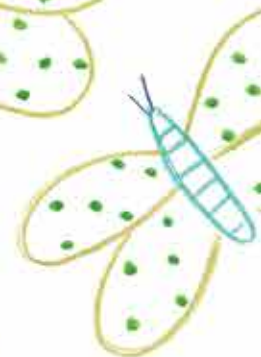
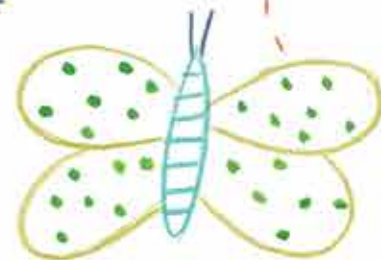




Mama Antelope was sad.

Baby Antelope came home.

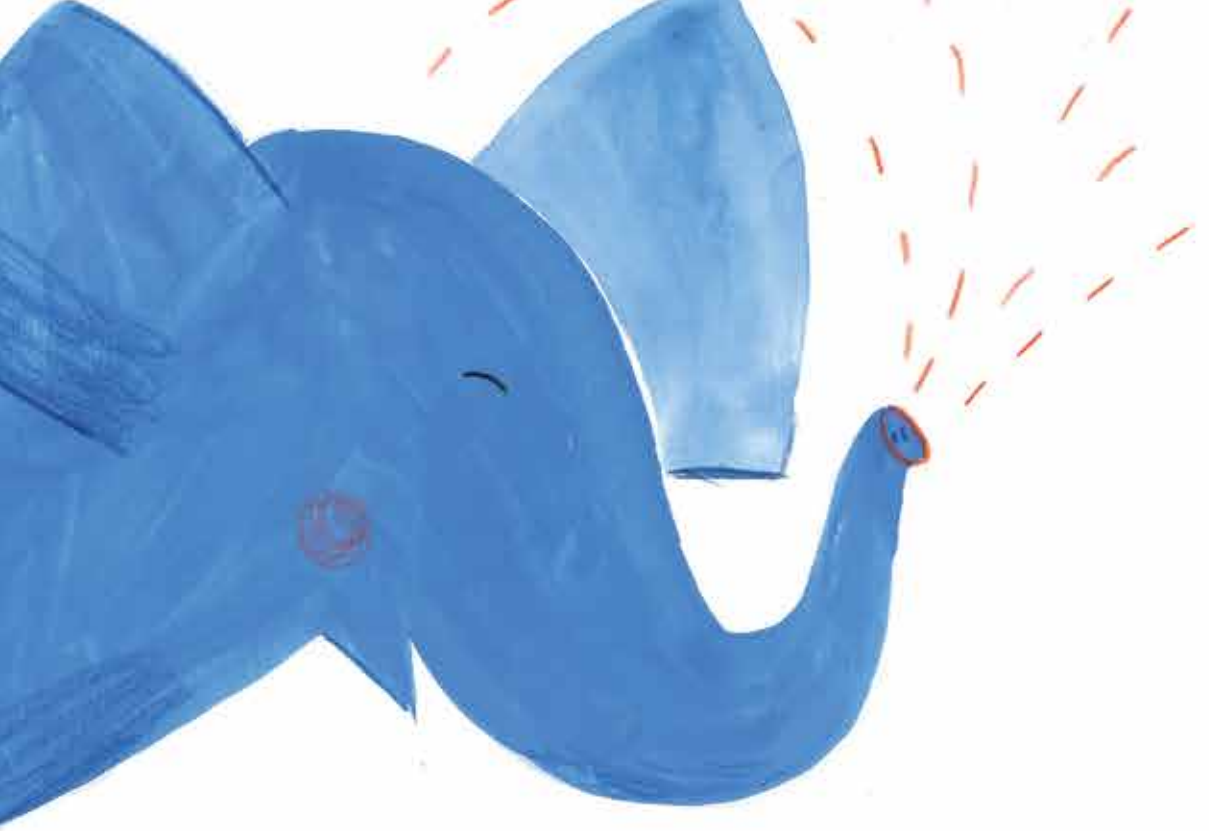
“Who is in our house?”
