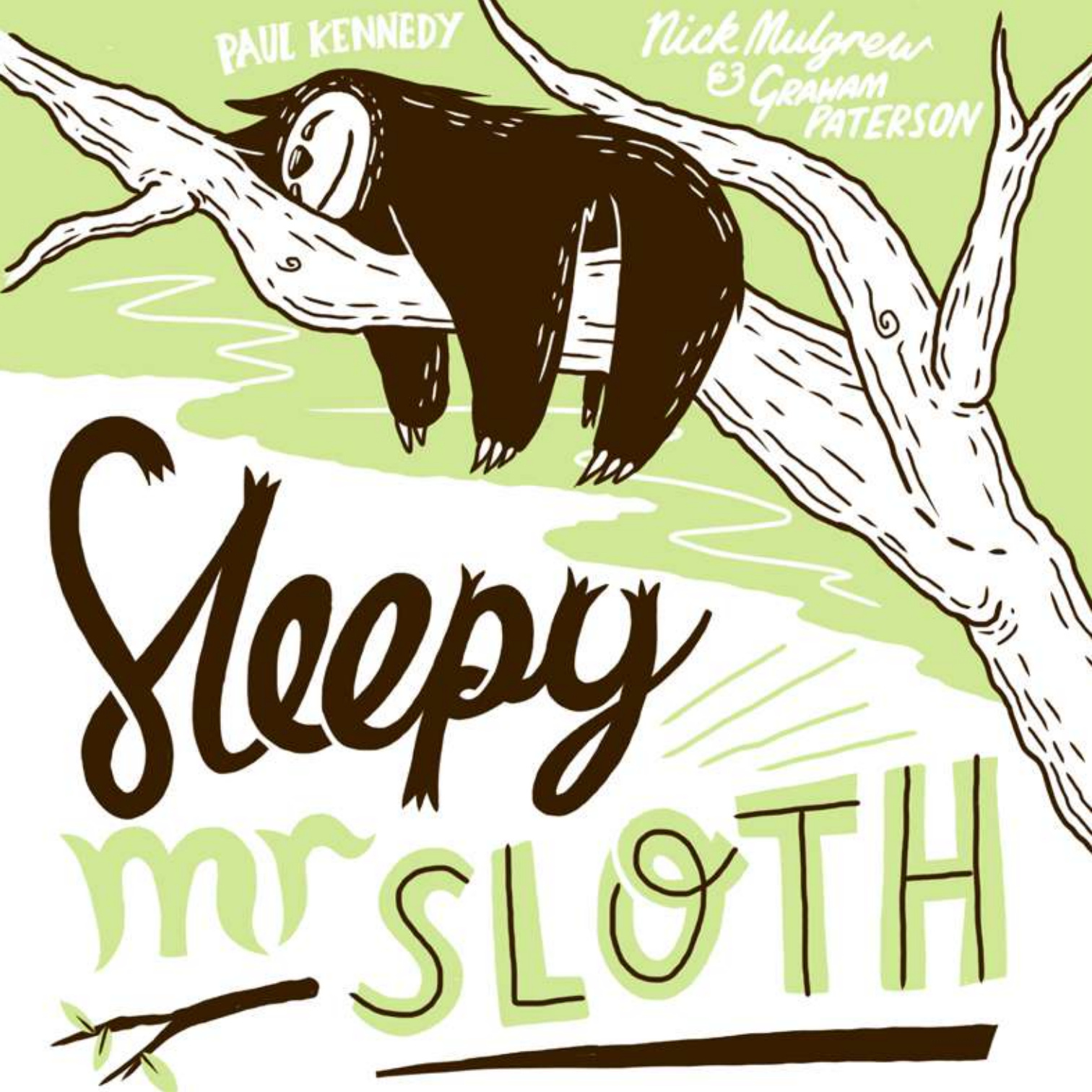

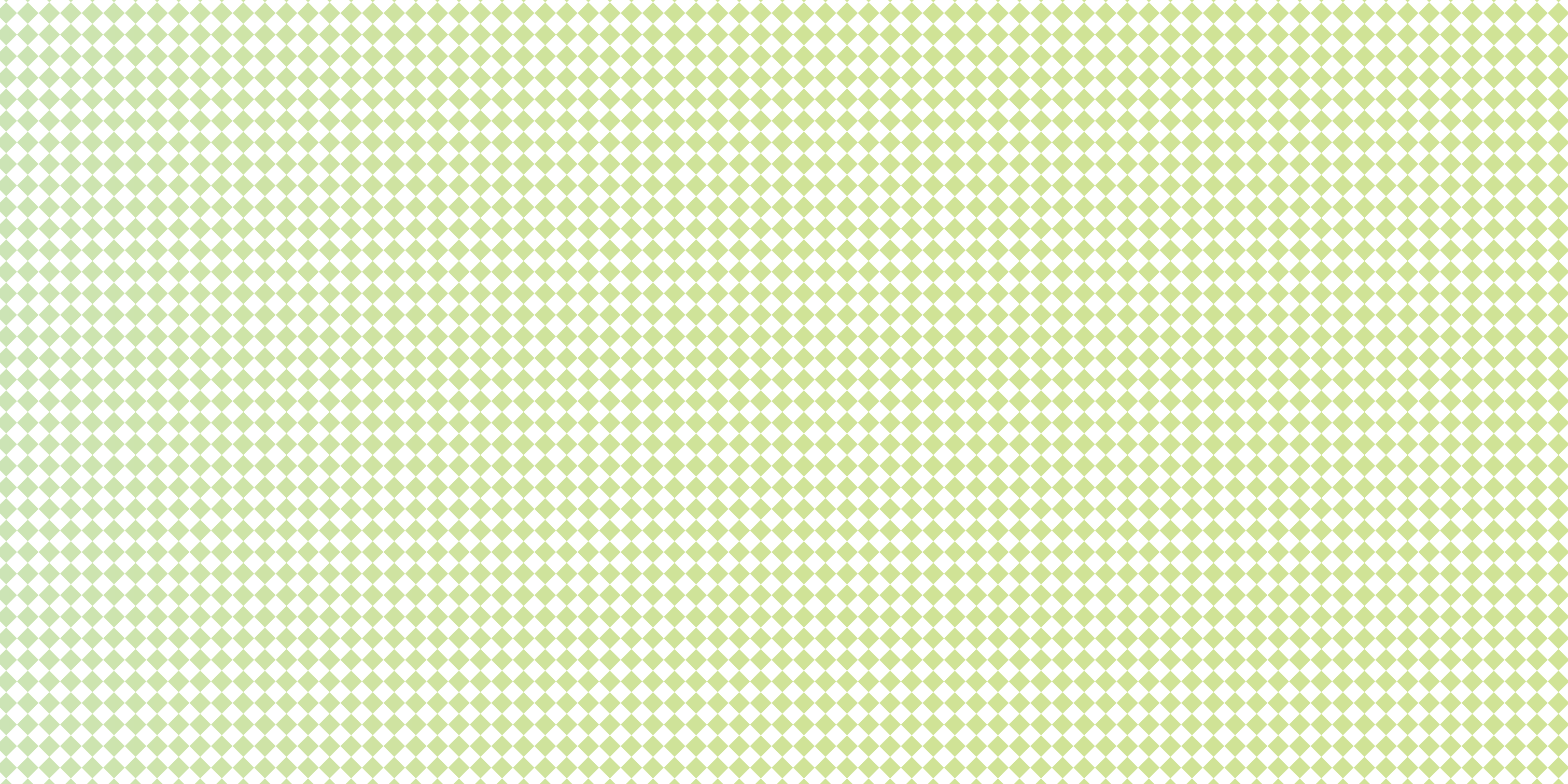

noise in the air!

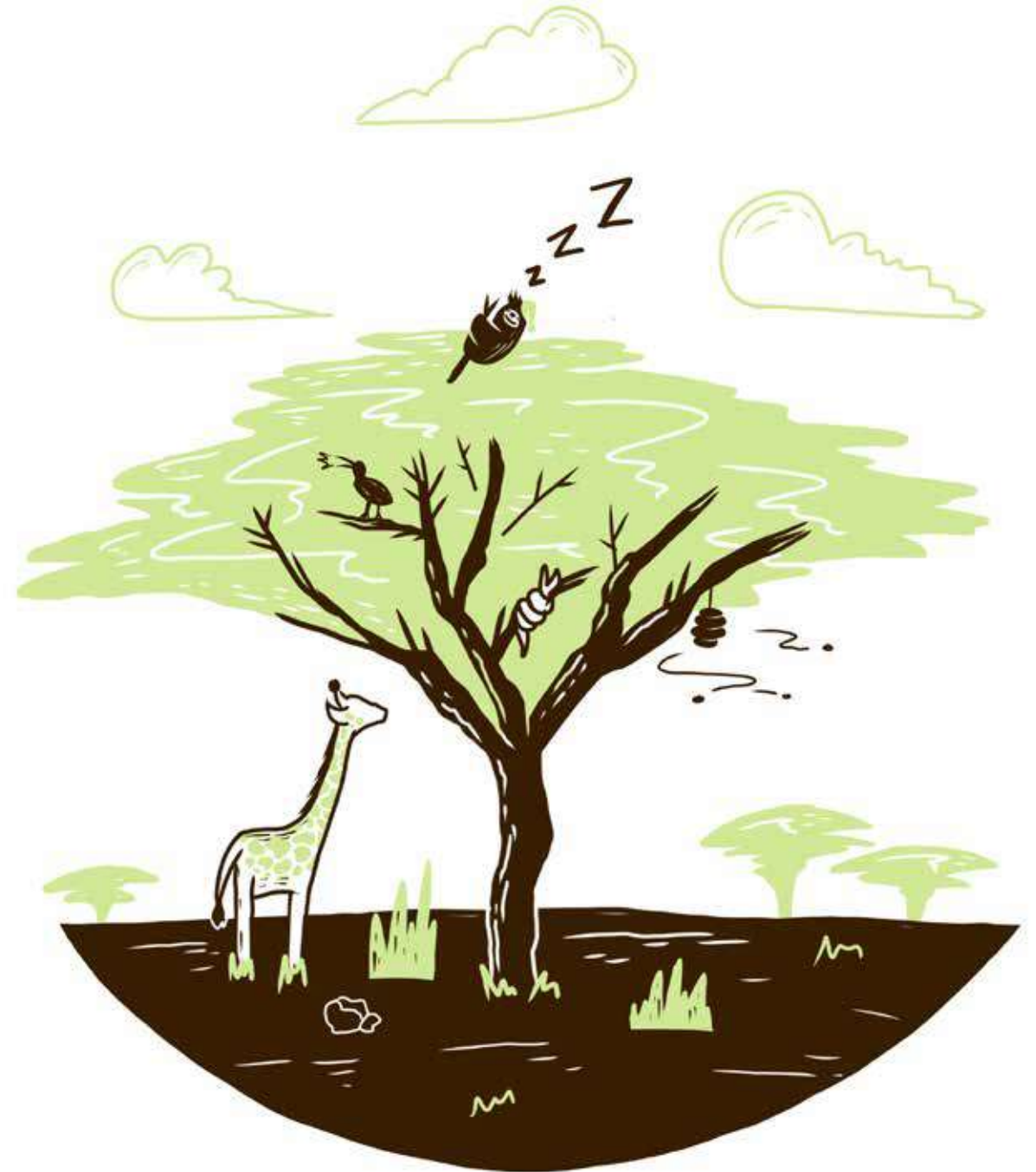


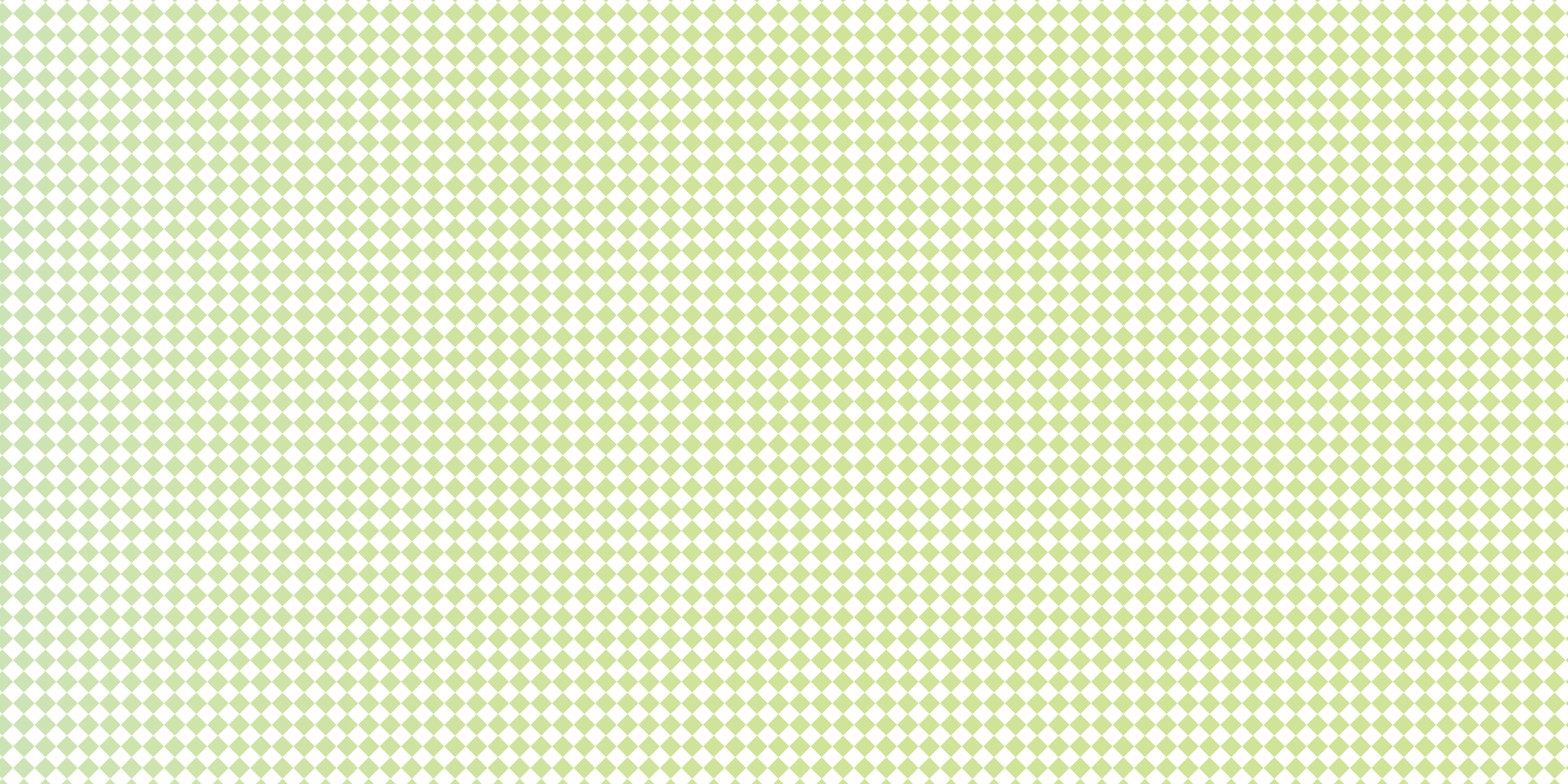
Try climb one more branch,
