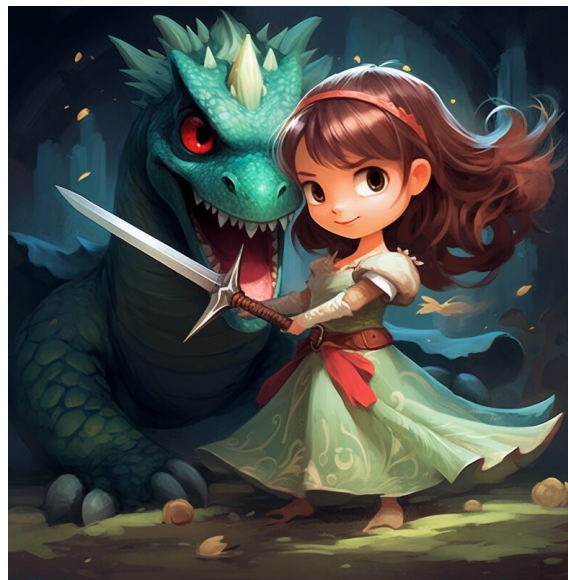
The dragon roared in pain and retreated, and Rose chased after it. They fought and fought, until the dragon lay defeated at her feet.
